PEDAGOGICAL CONCEPT AND PRELIMINARY PROGRAMME

I- CONTEXTE AND RATIONALE

Both the Agenda 2030 and the Agenda for Africa 2063 call for people-centered transformation. This condition can best be achieved through risen awareness for the relevance of Human Rights implementation at local level, through application of a Human Rights-based approach (HRBA), as well as through stakeholder cooperation in the implementation of Human Rights.

This online capacity-building workshop is a high-level specialized preparation for professionals in the field of local governance willing to upgrade their knowledge with the fundamentals of Human Rights.

The training content includes:

- Human Rights at Local Level: Relevance, principles, issues, and implementation
- SDGs, New Urban Agenda, and the Human Rights-based approach to local governance
- application of field-tested methods and tools for implementation at local level

The specific topic of the workshop is achieving inclusion and equality by guaranteeing women's rights. Key aspects of the urban environment - related to access, mobility, safety and freedom from violence, health and hygiene, climate resilience, and security of tenure – create disproportionate burdens for women and girls, thus exacerbating and reinforcing existing gender inequities. By advancing equality of women in cities, we unlock more inclusive economic and social development and ultimately contribute to the veracity of the claim to “leave no-one behind”.

II- OBJECTIVES OF THE ONLINE WORKSHOP

This online capacity-building workshop, while promoting the importance of Human Rights at the local level, aims to:

- Increase political commitment and social demand for inclusive and sustainable cities, anchored in the fundamentals of Human Rights, the Agenda 2030 and 2063 for Africa, and the New Urban Agenda, and the African Charter on Values and Principles of Decentralization, Local Governance and Development
- Increase engagement of local government actors in the field of Human Rights as well as to enhance city planners and decision makers' ability and commitment to promote inclusion through systems, policies, and processes
- Apply field-tested methods and policy tools for the advancement of Human Rights at the local level, such as the Toolkit for Urban Inclusion in Arab Cities, to the context of participants.
- Provide an opportunity for local experts and officials to enhance their capacities
- Serve as a platform to share experiences and good practices and initiate in-depth learning among participants

III- EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Local Governments officials and relevant stakeholders are equipped with knowledge and tools to make cities more inclusive, with a focus on a Human Rights-based approach to creating gender-inclusive cities. Information generated during the online workshop will contribute to the development of a new model policy on cities inclusive of women.

IV- PEDAGOGICAL APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

This online capacity-building workshop will be based on the principles of life-long learning adult education and will take place in a framework of co-construction of knowledge by drawing on the expertise and experience of the participants and the contributions of the facilitators.

The workshop is divided in **three parts, each lasting 2,5hrs** and delivered on three consecutive days. On **day one**, participants will receive input and get acquainted with the most pertinent concepts relevant to Human Rights protection at the local level. Topics include the relevance of Human Rights for the local level, the African Human Rights Architecture and other regional systems, and the connection between the effective fulfilment of city functions and the commitment to leave no one behind. The presentations are interactive, and room will be given for Q&A and discussion.

On **day two**, participants are introduced to the relationship between gender and Human Rights and subsequently split in small peer working groups along their professional affiliations. Participants are a key resource in this workshop. They have the practical experience and knowledge in local policymaking and implementing and are well acquainted with the topics of the workshop. Guided by the moderation, the participants will analyse concepts, Human Rights aspects, arguments, and evidence backing gender programs and policies in their city. Together, they will identify conditions that enable implementation of policies and programs, identify key stakeholders, and hear how to engage them. During the interactive workshop, they will discuss key practical steps and challenges faced by cities and how to overcome them.

The workshop continues **day three**, where the working groups compile and present their findings. The working groups will be moderated by the International Centre for the Promotion of Human Rights at the Local and Regional Levels under the auspices of UNESCO, UNESCO Cairo, and urban inclusion experts. Applying the field-tested Toolkit for Equality-methodology, the facilitators will guide the discussion and assist to contextualize the findings.

The information generated during the working groups will contribute to the development of a new model policy on local governance inclusive of women.

V- MODALITIES

The online capacity-building workshop will be led and facilitated by the International Centre for the promotion of Human Rights at the local and regional levels under the auspices of UNESCO, the UNESCO Chair for Human Rights and Human Security, UNESCO Regional Office in Cairo and partners. It is organized in close cooperation with UCLG ALGA.

The workshop will be **held in English**. It is designed as a webinar.

The workshop uses a **remote synchronous instructional mode**, where participants and facilitators meet virtually and simultaneously during scheduled meeting times.

Communication and collaboration tools will be provided via webinars.humanrightsgolocal.org. Access links and codes will be provided to the participants.
